



Robyn Hamilton has dedicated over twenty years to building effective organizations and strengthening communities. She served in numerous capacities at Novant Health such as the Director of Community Engagement and Sports Partnerships and the Director of Corporate Relations for the \$150 million-dollar regional Foundation. In 2011 Robyn was asked to be a part of a distinguished leadership host committee to manage the 2012 Democratic National Convention Host Committee, the world's largest political Convention. Prior to the Convention, Robyn served as President and CEO of a regional non-profit, the Carolinas Minority Supplier Development Council, Inc. (MSDC).
